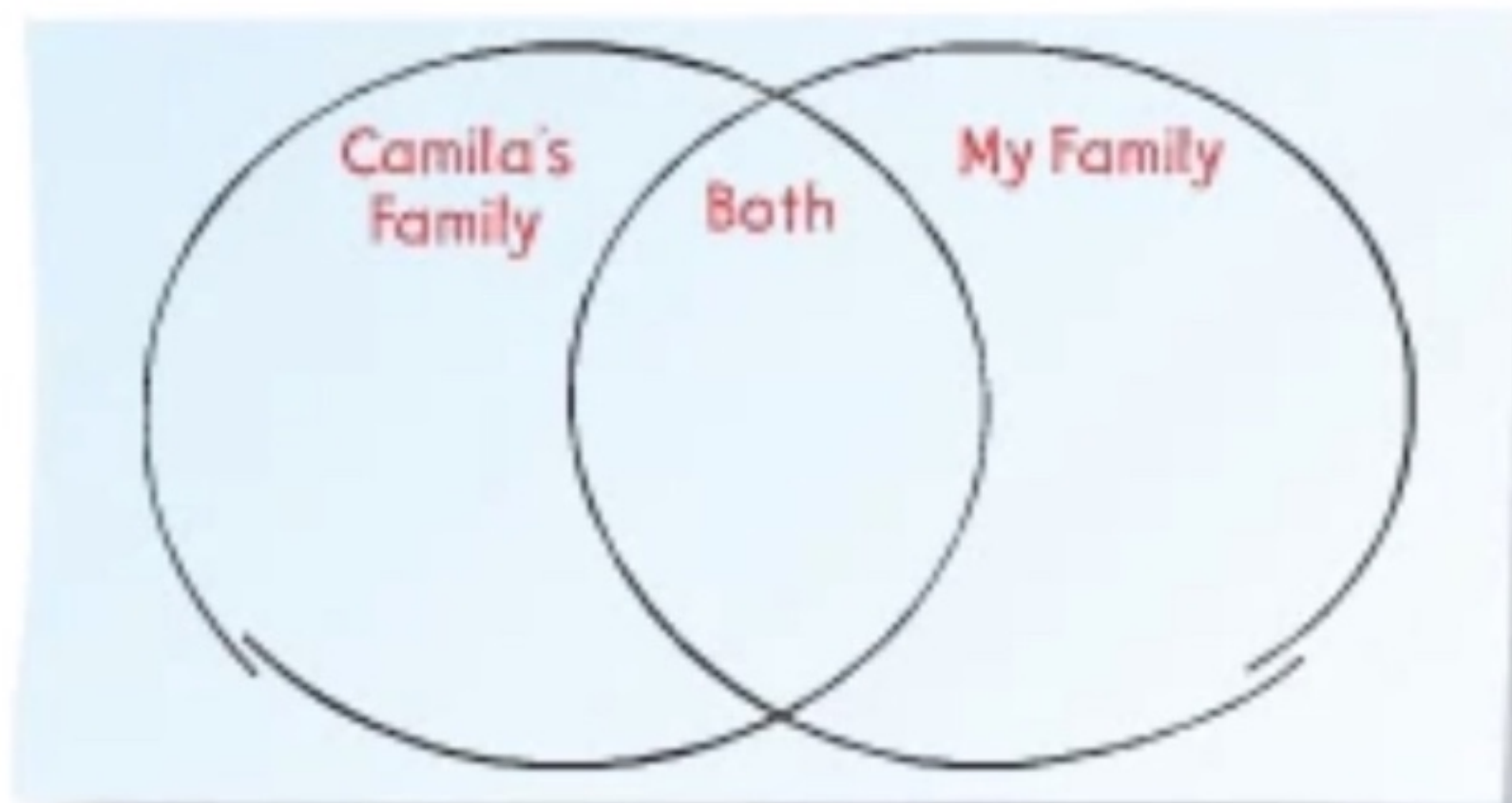

- 🔊 My mother and I go to school together. That's because she teaches Spanish in my school. When we are at home, I like to help her cook dinner.



🔊 Sometimes when my Grandma Marta comes to **visit**, I dress up and put on a show for her. Today she is teaching me a song. It goes like this:

🔊 *There once was a sailor at sea who liked to play the guitar. When he **remembered** his far away land he picked his guitar, and started to sing: On the high sea, on the high sea, on the high sea. [repeat]*





René is my little brother. Our friends and family come to the house for his birthday. We play games, eat, and sing “Happy Birthday” to him.

- Here is my family: Grandmother Marta and Grandfather Rigoberto had four children. Almost all of them came to René's birthday party.







Grandma came with Aunt María Irene and Victoria. Uncle Andrés came with Victor and Mar Isabel. Aunt Martica, Uncle Miguel, Gabriela, and Leticia came too. Soon the house was full.

- 🔊 We played many games. Aunt María Irene showed us how to play hopscotch. Little Leticia put on a **crown** to dance. Grandpa Rigoberto danced with **cousin** Mar Isabel.



- On Sundays we go to church with Grandma. Then we all go to Aunt Martica and Uncle Miguel's house. After lunch we play music and sing.





- Uncle Miguel plays the double bass. Uncle Andrés plays the violin. Aunt Darleen plays the **piano**. Victor plays the clarinet and Mar Isabel plays the flute.

- 🔊 What I like best is when Papi takes us fishing. Most of the time my hook gets stuck on a rock. I can't wait to catch my first fish.

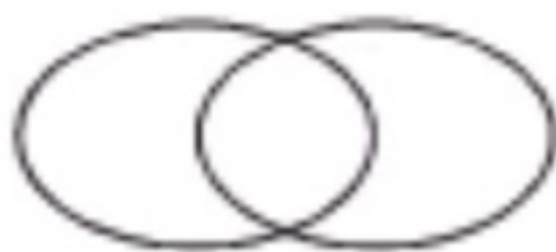
